POSITION DUTIES

- Develops, implements, and coordinates resource management plans, programs, and projects;
- Assists with preparation of grant proposals related to resource management;
- Establishes and implements methods for monitoring natural resources;
- Provides cost estimates for Natural Resource Management Program budget;
- Prepares or directs consultant work on biotic surveys for environmental assessments;
- Prepares or assists with preparation of regulatory permit applications;
- Serves as departmental liaison with resource management agencies and organizations and participates in public meetings;
- Develops cooperative working relationships with Parks staff emphasizing teamwork among divisions;
- Performs other related duties as assigned.
