This program is organized by members of the California-Pacific chapter of the Society for Range Management ("CalPac SRM") for 33 years now. Our goal has been to introduce students to the professional world of plant, animal, and landscape management. To do this we invite experts in scientific disciplines related to wildlife, forestry, rangeland, and

plants, as well as experienced professionals who are involved in managing resources of these kinds on a daily basis. We aim to make the camp a fun experience for the campers, and interesting as well. One of our goals is to send you home with a useful understanding of the great diversity of career opportunities that are available, and the different paths through colleges and universities that can take you there.

The camp is run by a group of volunteers

who take our personal time to organize each year's event and serve as primary staff for all or parts of the camp week. We do our best to limit costs to the greatest extent we can without undermining the educational and social experience of the program.

What is Range Camp?

Range Camp is a week long program that consists of lectures, hands on activities, a ranch tour, BBQ at the beach, group projects, a plant identification test, and a final exam. At the end of camp the three Top Campers are invited to represent CalPac SRM at the annual Society for Range Management's High School Youth Forum.

During camp campers should expect to do hands on projects each day associated with lectures that often includes digging a soils pit to examine and compare soils, hiking local trails to learn plant families and names, completing an inventory of a local stream to determine creek health, learning wildlife survey techniques, etc.

Where is Range Camp Held?

Range Camp is held in Half Moon Bay, California on the University of California Cooperative Extension's Elkus Ranch Environmental Education Center. Please note that applications should NOT be submitted directly to Elkus Ranch. For additional information regarding Elkus Ranch please visit <u>http://</u><u>ucanr.edu/sites/elkus_ranch/</u>.

Eligibility

Age requirement: In order to be considered for Range Camp the applicant must still be in high school, but have completed the 9th grade by the start of camp. Students who will have graduated high school before Jan 2018 will not be eligible to attend the High School Youth Forum, in the event they win the Top Camper contest.

Camp Cost

The camp fee is \$450.00. This includes meals, lodging, recreation, and transportation costs while at camp. Transportation to camp from the camper's home on Sunday and returning from camp on Friday is not included in the camp fee. Arrangements can be made with the camp staff to shuttle campers between the camp and

the San Francisco Airport or the Emeryville Train Station. Emergency medical insurance is provided through UCANR.

Sponsorship

Majority of camper receive sponsorship from local organizations, such as Resource Conservation Districts (RCD) to cover the camp fee. We encourage all campers being sponsored to give a presentation to the board of the sponsoring organization after camp

is over. This helps the board members understand what Range Camp is and can help interested participants in the future get sponsorship.

Range Camp will help facilitate coordination with local organizations but it is up to the applicant to develop and secure those relation-ships.

Space is limited to 25-30 students each year.

Applicants are selected based upon the following criteria:

previous year's waiting list

- Senior students given priority (last year of eligibility)
- 3) Regional repre-

sentativeness (including HI students) 5) Gender equity

4) Preference given to those who have not attended previously
