Since 2001, I have been a Livestock and Natural Resources Advisor with UC Cooperative Extension covering Napa, Solano, Yolo and Sacramento Counties. Before becoming an advisor, I received my Bachelor's degree at Sonoma State University in business management, served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Ecuador where I worked with indigenous groups to improve animal husbandry practices, and then received my MS degree at UC Davis in International Agricultural Development with a specialization in ruminant ecology. Much of my work in Cooperative Extension has focused on rangeland management and the use of livestock for specific vegetation management objectives in range and croplands. Other work includes invasive weed control, oak recruitment strategies, water quality, niche meat marketing, and grazing management systems. In July 2011 I assumed County Director responsibilities for the UC Cooperative Extension office in Solano County and in July 2014 I became the Director of the new three-county UC Cooperative Extension Capitol Corridor unit that includes Sacramento, Solano and Yolo counties.

I have been an active member of the California-Pacific section of SRM since 2001 and served as a Director from 2006-2009 and as the Needlegrass Notes Newsletter Editor from 2010-2012. My interest in rangelands started from growing up on a cow-calf cattle ranch with summer pasture in Siskiyou and winter grazing in Tehama County. I have been a member of SRM since 2002 while majoring in Rangeland Resource Science at Humboldt State University. After graduation I started working for NRCS as a soil conservationist in Klamath Falls, OR. In 2008, I became the Rangeland Management Specialist for California NRCS assisting both Mendocino and Lake Counties. Now I work for Red Bluff NRCS as a Soil Conservationist. Due to my personal and professional background I have dedicated my career to providing planning and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers in order to improve natural resources. Throughout my career I've worked on a variety of land uses and ecotypes, but have always enjoyed focusing on pasture and range. In recent years I have been attending Cal-Pac Section meetings. I have found this experience to be personally and professionally rewarding. I'm excited for the opportunity to increase my participation in Cal Pac SRM in effort to become more involved in California rangelands issues.

Scott Oneto

I am a fourth generation native to Amador County, California. For generations, my family has been actively engaged in local agriculture and natural resources. I received my Bachelor's degree in Plant Sciences from U.C. Davis and a Master's degree in Horticulture and Agronomy from U.D. Davis. My thesis focused on developing control strategies for five spreading invasive weeds that lacked sufficient control recommendations in California. They included Scotch broom, tree tobacco, hedge parsley, periwinkle and houndstongue. Many of these weeds are non-agronomic weeds that mostly cause concern in rangelands, riparian areas, forestry, non-crop, roadsides and disturbed sites.

Currently, I am an Agriculture and Natural Resources Advisor and County Director with the University of California Cooperative Extension in El Dorado, Amador, Calaveras and Tuolumne Counties. Over my 15 years with Cooperative Extension, I have offered a variety of educational outreach opportunities for my livestock and natural resource clientele including pasture management, ranch water quality, pond management, road maintenance, and a multitude of topics on weed biology and control.

My research program focuses on improving annual range production through successful weed control and preventing the spread of non-desirable plants. Currently I am collaborating on a project with East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) in the Mokelumne watershed to develop a comprehensive range assessment of EBMUD grazing lands and to develop a range monitoring program that utilizes some of the latest science and technology including GIS and residual dry matter mapping to guide landscape scale management decisions for land owners, land managers and policy makers.

I have attended a number of national SRM meetings and California-Pacific Section meetings. I look for-
